















PSAT

- Reasons for taking the PSAT
 - Practice for the SAT
 - Enter competition for National Merit Scholarship
 - 1.5 million juniors took PSAT in 2016
 - About 8,200 became National Merit Scholars
 - Qualify for scholarships and enrichment programs that use the PSAT results
 - 3 parts: Critical Reading, Math Problem Solving Skills and Writing Skills

ACT



- On April 3, 2018 ALL juniors in the state of MN will take the ACT with Writing at their high school
- The ACT is the test taken most often by RHS students for 4 year college admissions (The RHS curriculum is most aligned with ACT standards)
- All colleges will accept ACT for admission
- Used to determine NCAA eligibility (code is 9999)


ACT Description

- Math (60 minutes- 60 questions)
- Reading (35 minutes- 40 questions)
- English (45 minutes -75 questions)
- Science Reasoning (35 minutes- 40 questions)

ACT Writing Test

- The ACT Writing Test is optional (it will be required for the April 3 testing at RHS)
- As of Fall 2017, U of M Rochester is the only college in MN that requires the ACT Writing test
- There are many colleges in MN that RECOMMEND THE ACT Writing Test, including the U of M-Twin Cities

SAT and SAT Subject Tests

SAT Reasoning Test: Critical Reading, Math & Writing

- Usually taken in spring of junior year (March, May, June)
- Test used for college admission
- May be the preferred test for SOME highly selective universities and many east and west coast schools.
- Can be used to determine NCAA eligibility (Code in 9999)
- Cost \$45

SAT Subject tests


- Used by highly selective universities
- Student should check with each college or university
- Measures student knowledge of a particular subject
- May take up to 3 on any one Saturday
- Cost \$20 plus \$9 to \$20 per individual subject test

Registering and Preparing for the ACT or SAT

- Registration & Practice booklet– in Career Center Online Registration
 - ACT at <u>www.actstudent.org</u> you won't need to register online for the April 3 test date
 - SAT at <u>www.collegeboard.com</u>
 - When registering you can send up to 4 free official scores to schools of your choice
 - Fee waiver for those who qualify-see your counselor
- Preparation and Practice
 - ACT Prep class at RHS
 - Naviance Test Prep through Family Connection
 - ACT online Prep-\$39.95 for 1 year subscription
